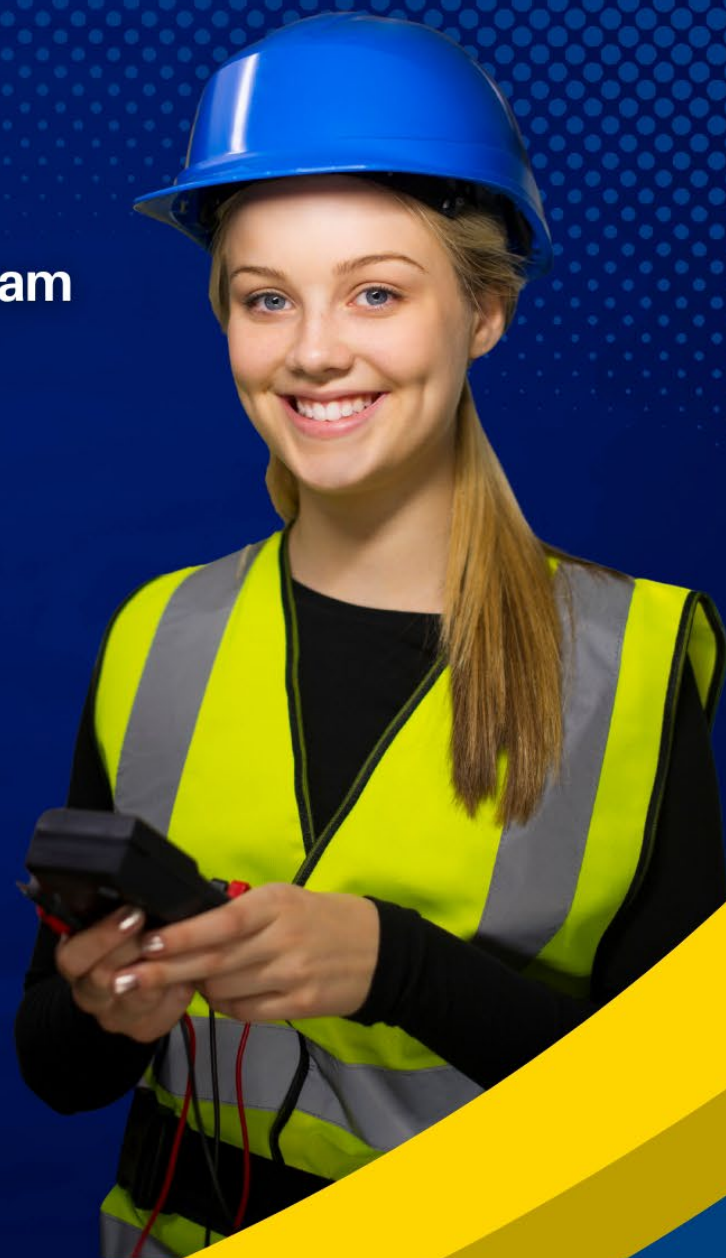

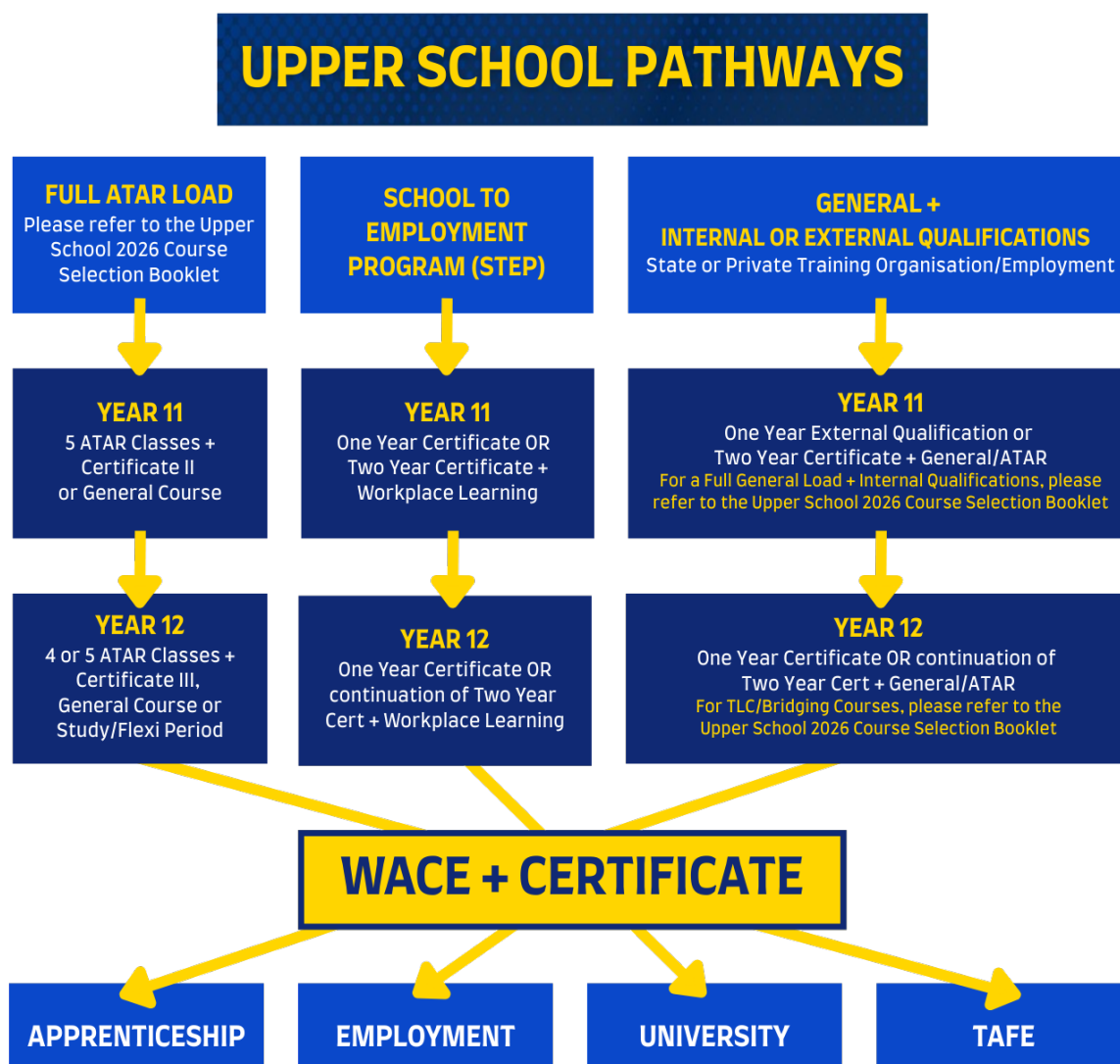

UPPER SCHOOL PATHWAYS – Introduction

At Comet Bay College, Year 11 and 12 students can choose between two VET (Vocational Education and Training) pathways – **The School to Employment Program (STEP)** or **General Courses with an External Qualification** arrangement with a **Registered Training Organisation (RTO)**, **Private Training Provider** or **Employer (SBAT)**.



Please note this booklet is applicable for **VET Pathways and STEP ONLY**. For internal qualifications, ATAR and General Pathways, please refer to the Upper School 2026 Course Selection Booklet.

WHAT IS STEP?

STEP is a program designed for students who are preparing for work or entry into further education, training, apprenticeships, or traineeships.

- There are a variety of qualifications to choose from including but not limited to: trades, hospitality, fashion and beauty, business, animal studies and media.
- Qualifications contribute to your Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE) and future pathways, including TAFE Diplomas and University.
- Many students gain employment during or on completion of their program.

Prerequisites for STEP

The STEP Program has its own unique prerequisites students' must meet to be considered eligible. These are:

- Direct application to the STEP Program.
 - For Certificate II Programs, a C-grade minimum is required, and pre-qualified through NAPLAN or achieved Category 2 in all OLNA components.
 - For Certificate III programs, a B or strong C Grade minimum is required, and pre-qualified through NAPLAN or achieved Category 3 in all OLNA components.
 - For Certificate IV programs, an A or strong B grade minimum is required, and pre-qualified through NAPLAN or achieved Category 3 in all OLNA components.
 - It is preferable for students to have high grades in subjects applicable to the courses they want to apply for. (For example, a student wishing to complete a **Certificate III in Business** would be expected to have a B grade or higher in English).
 - **It is important that students enrolling in STEP maintain their C grades for the entire year. Where grades drop in the second semester, potentially enrolments may be withdrawn.**
- Above 80% Attendance.
- Low negative behaviours records and no suspensions.
- Attendance by student and parent at an information night (mandatory).
- Direct application and acceptance of a position from TAFE or private RTO.

Grades and attendance are obtained from a student's **Semester One** report on application; therefore, the first half of the year is critical to ensure future success. TAFE qualifications in STEP are extremely competitive. To ensure a position, students must demonstrate a high degree of personal excellence.

Cost of STEP Qualifications

All qualifications initiated through South and North Metropolitan TAFE are considered **Profile Funded**, meaning that they are exempt from tuition, resource and enrolment fees. However, depending on the chosen course, students may be required to pay incidental fees, obtain a First Aid certificate from an external RTO such as St John's; or purchase a uniform, protective equipment, textbooks, or trade equipment/tools.

All students accepted into STEP will be enrolled in Authority Developed Workplace Learning (ADWPL). The cost is \$100 which includes provision of logbook and Workplace Learning Officer visits.

Where a STEP student chooses a VET qualification outside of South or North Metropolitan TAFE, it is likely that tuition and resource fees will apply. **Comet Bay College is mindful of the financial pressures many families are currently facing and subsidises 50% of the full RTO charge to a maximum of \$1000.** Charges displayed against each Fee for Service (FFS) course description reflect the remaining amount payable by families.

- FFS qualifications must be paid by families in full prior to the commencement of Term 1, 2026 to enable student enrolment.
- Non-payment of the full cost of qualification prior to the commencement of Term 1 will result in the student's enrolment being withdrawn.
- Payment will be requested from 1 December 2025.
- **The college is required by the RTO to pay these charges in advance to confirm enrolment. Where a student withdraws from a qualification after enrolment is confirmed and prior to completion, the charge is NON-REFUNDABLE.**

TWO YEAR qualification – STEP ONLY

The Certificate II in Engineering (Mechanical Fitter and Machinist Pre-apprenticeship) is an initiative of the Kwinana Industries Council (KIC). It is a two-year program which students complete during 11 and 12 alongside their school studies. The program takes 15 students (max) per year.

Students will develop trade like skills and knowledge in a range of engineering and manufacturing tasks which will enhance their entry level employment prospects for apprenticeship, traineeships or general employment in an engineering-related workplace. Some of the units of competency will articulate into an apprenticeship course in the metals trades areas, which may reduce the amount of time required to complete an apprenticeship.

Workplace learning provides students with the opportunity to attend the workplace and experience a range of vocations within their field of interest. Students are required to undertake 150 hours of work placement during the two-year program.

The Certificate II Process Plant Operations course is delivered by industry experienced educators in state-of-the-art processing facilities. Students gain qualifications to work as entry level Process Plant Operators, or in a range of careers in the resources sector including Mechanical Fitting, Instrumental Electrical and Heavy Diesel Mechanical. Graduates can also choose to advance their qualifications through further education and/or training. For example, students can go on to complete the Diploma and Advanced Diploma of PPO as an alternative entry to university. Process Plant Technicians control, monitor and maintain the machinery and equipment used to produce, refine and pump chemicals, oil, gas and petroleum. This is done via a control room and through hands-on work throughout a facility.

GENERAL WITH AN EXTERNAL QUALIFICATION

General with an External Qualification is designed for students who would like to pursue an off-site qualification while also attending general classes.

- A general timetable is selected with a qualification that runs on a Wednesday.
 - It is possible for a student to complete an internal and external qualification, subject to availability. For example, a student could complete a Certificate III Music at school and an external qualification on Wednesday.
- Some of these qualifications have Workplace Learning requirements that must be completed by the student during the holidays, exam weeks or on the completion of general classes in Term 3 (Year 12's) or Term 4 (Year 11's).

GENERAL CLASSES

FOUR DAYS A WEEK

Students can pick from a range of General Classes, or another qualification run on school premises.

OFF-SITE TRAINING

ONE DAY A WEEK

(Wednesday)

Students will attend their RTO/Workplace/Training

Prerequisites for General - With an External Qualification

External Certificate prerequisites depend on the individual RTO and the level of the Certificate. However, as a good rule to follow:

- All Certificate II Qualifications require C grades or higher, and pre-qualified through NAPLAN or achieved Category 2 in all OLNA components.
 - All Certificate III qualifications require B grades or higher, and pre-qualified through NAPLAN or achieved Category 3 in all OLNA components.
 - Certificate IV's can only be studied in Year 12.
 - For Certificate IV programs, an A or strong B grade minimum is required, and pre-qualified through NAPLAN or achieved Category 3 in all OLNA components.
- Some Certificate III/IV qualifications accept credit transfers for units completed in the previous year. It is recommended that students wishing to pursue a Certificate IV in Year 12 complete adjacent Certificate III qualifications to optimise which units they can transfer.
 - For example, a Certificate III in Health Services Assistance leads to a Certificate IV in Preparation for Health and Nursing.
 - A Certificate III in School Based Education Support leads to a Certificate IV in School Based Education.
 - In-school Health and Physical Education qualifications all contain a First Aid unit that is transferable to other qualifications.
- Direct application to the VET Department.
- 80-90% attendance.
- Low negative behaviours records and no suspensions.
- Student and parent attendance at an information night (mandatory).
- Direct application and acceptance of a position from TAFE or private RTO.

Grades and attendance are obtained from a student's **Semester One** report on application; therefore, the first half of the year is critical to ensure future success. RTO qualifications are extremely competitive, and placement is not guaranteed. To ensure a position, students must demonstrate a high degree of personal excellence.

Cost of External Qualifications

Where students are required to complete Workplace Learning hours as part of their qualification, parents will be required to pay \$100 for enrolment in Authority Developed Workplace Learning (ADWPL). The cost includes provision of logbook and Workplace Learning Officer visits.

Where a student chooses a VET qualification outside of South or North Metro TAFE, it is likely that tuition and resource fees will apply. **Comet Bay College is mindful of the financial pressures many families are currently facing and subsidises 50% of the full RTO charge to a maximum of \$1000.** Charges displayed against each Fee for Service (FFS) course description reflect the remaining amount payable by families.

- Non-payment of the full cost of the qualification prior to the commencement of Term 1 will result in the student's enrolment being withdrawn.
- Non-payment of the charge prior to Term 1 Week 4 will result in the student's enrolment being withdrawn.
- Payment will be requested from 1 December 2025.
- **The college is required by the RTO to pay these charges in advance to secure enrolment. Where a student withdraws from a qualification after enrolment is confirmed and prior to completion, the charge is NON-REFUNDABLE.**

Workplace Learning (ADWPL)

ONE YEAR qualification

Workplace Learning (ADWPL) is an authority-developed endorsed program. For each 55 hours in a real workplace, a student must complete the Authority's Workplace Learning Logbook and Workplace Learning Skills Journal. The logbook includes an attendance record, task schedule and workplace supervisor's evaluation of student performance.

The logbook is validated by the workplace supervisor. Students must respond to ten questions after each 55 hours in the workplace.

The questions are based on the core skills for Work Developmental Framework and may be scaffolded for students, as necessary. The Skills Journal is validated by the Workplace Learning Coordinator.

WHAT IS A SBAT/TRAINEESHIP?

A school-based apprenticeship or traineeship is an employment-based learning pathway that combines off and on the job training, which leads to a nationally recognised qualification. SBAT students can enter an employment arrangement directly with an employer or through a Group Training Organisation (GTO).

An SBAT qualification allows students to earn money while gaining hands-on experience, mentoring, support and supervision from an employer, and can contribute to a student's WACE. They are required to do at least 7.5 hours a week with their employer or, in the case of a GTO, with the host employer. The minimum hour requirements apply throughout the full term of the SBAT arrangement, including during the school holidays.

SBAT qualifications are mostly at a Certificate II or III level and are suggested by their industries as suitable for delivery to school students.

Prerequisites for SBAT/Traineeship

- Must be 15 years or older.
- A C grade minimum across all MESH subjects, with higher grades applicable to the course you are wanting to apply for.
- Above 80% Attendance.
- Low negative behaviours records and no suspensions.
- Student and parent at an information night (mandatory).

A \$100 fee is attached for enrolment in Authority Delivered Workplace Learning (ADWPL). In some circumstances, additional costs may be sought for things like uniform, PPE, etc.

- Building and Construction
- Business
- Civil Construction
- Community Pharmacy
- Early Childhood Education and Care
- Floristry
- Animal Studies

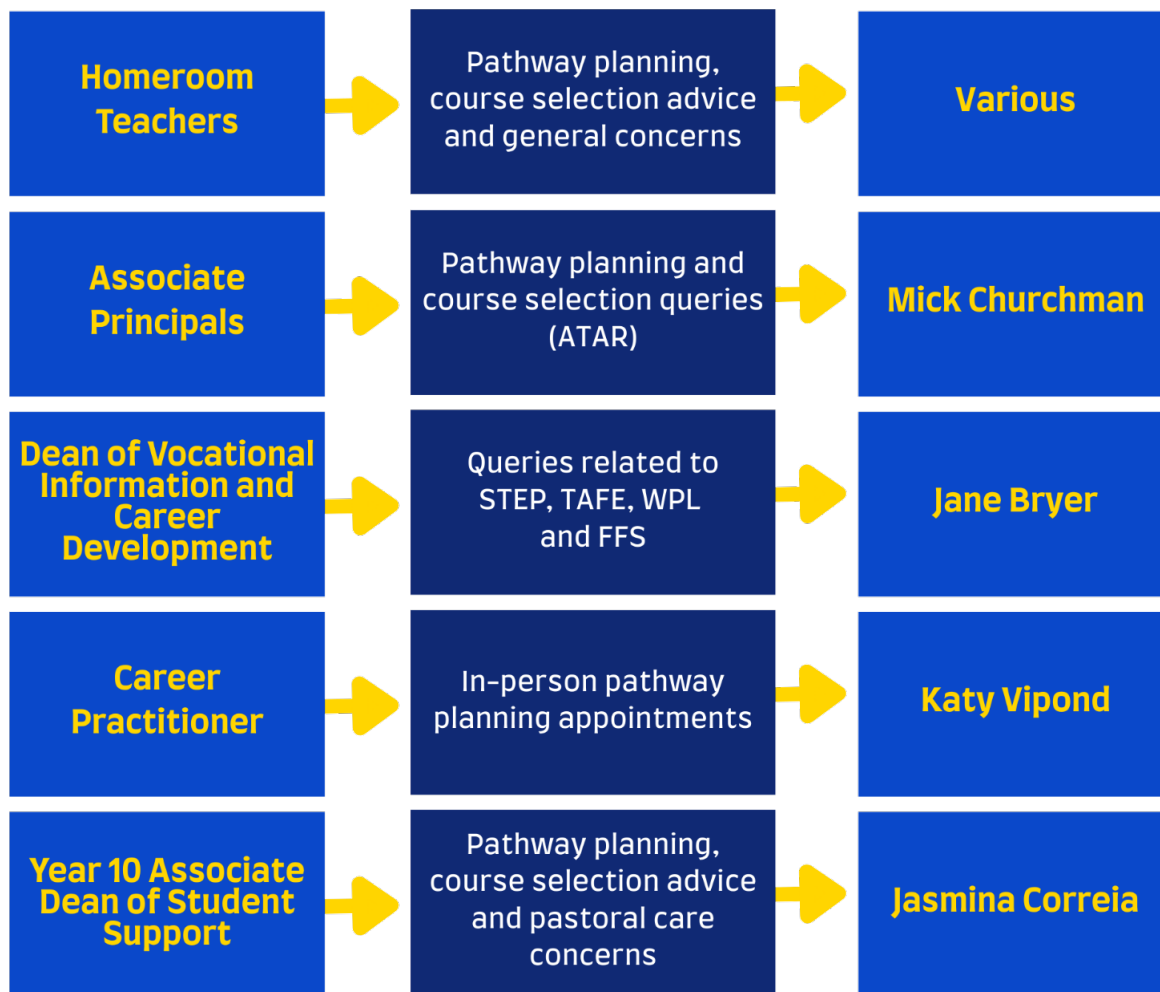
CHOOSING A PROGRAM OF STUDY

Movement between pathways is not easy, and it can place secondary graduation at risk. Therefore, we encourage students and parents to think carefully and try to minimise movement later during the student's senior years.

- **Prerequisites** – Each qualification has its own set of prerequisites; please ensure you meet the criteria before selecting the course.
- **Future goals** – Ensure that courses chosen meet criteria for future employment or studies. If career goals are not clear, select a course that offers flexibility, interest, and a realistic chance of success.
- **Interests** – Choose courses that you are likely to enjoy as you will spend a considerable amount of time studying them in upper school.
- **Financial Commitment** – We recommend families take into consideration course costs and their affordability at this stage of the Course Selection Process.
 - In making your selection, please be aware that ALL Year 11 and 12 courses carry **Compulsory Charges** which require **FULL PAYMENT** by Week 4 of Term 1 to avoid referral of any outstanding charges to debt collection.
(Except for **Fee for Service Qualification** that require payment in full to secure enrolment PRIOR to the commencement of Term 1, **February 2026.**)
- **Course Delivery Length** – in the case of courses/qualifications that are delivered over Years 11 and 12, please consider the financial commitment for both years.
